▶ OUTDOOR EDUCATION & TRAVEL ABROAD

Rooted in the natural beauty of the California wilderness, our annual camping and grade-level outdoor programs serve as a reminder that we are a part of a world much bigger than ourselves. Beach camping, rigorous backcountry expeditions, and a Southwest Road Trip offer students opportunities to learn from nature, practice the outdoor skills of self-reliance, teamwork, and leadership, and to become active stewards of the environment.

Our travel program challenges students to develop an international perspective through a curriculum and set of experiences that focus on cultural perspectives. The culminating senior trip to India encourages students to expand their knowledge, skills, emotional intelligence, and global competencies necessary to enable them to move beyond the tolerance of diversity to genuine engagement as a global citizen.

▶ PATHLESS PROJECT

The Pathless Project allows seniors an in-depth practicum/ research experience requiring the planning and implementation of a passion project. This project challenges students to direct their own learning. The Pathless Project culminates in a presentation to a community audience.

Oak Grove High School offers a challenging college-preparatory program that is approved by the University of California and is designed to exceed admission requirements for the most rigorous and selective universities across the country.

All Oak Grove High School students select from a number of fine and performing arts electives which encourage and support the development of an aesthetic sense toward all art forms as well as integrate and honor individual student interests and passions. Students are also asked to think deeply, approach learning from multiple perspectives, and make connections across disciplines. Students are empowered to take responsibility and ownership of their learning so they are prepared to meet the demands of college and beyond.

► CO-CURRICULAR & ATHLETICS

Participation in Community Service, Fit for Life, Advisory, and the Camping and Outdoor Education Programs are mandatory each year. Student-generated and student-led clubs are encouraged and have included STEM, Disc Golf, Poetry, and other interests.

Oak Grove is a member of the Condor League. Students compete in girls' and boys' volleyball, soccer, cross country, and basketball according to student interest and enrollment.

► MINIMUM CRADUATION REQUIREMENTS & **ACADEMIC CURRICULUM**

The school year is divided into two semesters.

ENGLISH • 4 years

MATH • 3 years

SCIENCE • 3 years (including two years of lab science)

HISTORY • 4 years

ART ELECTIVES • 4 years (including one year of Visual or Performing Arts)

WORLD LANGUAGE • 3 years

Oak Grove School does not offer AP courses. Honors options are offered in core subjects for students who have shown mastery of the academic skills necessary for higher level research and studying. Prerequisite for Honors is teacher's approval. Students wishing to explore Advanced Placement classes may do so online with administration approval.

► RANKING & CRADES

Oak Grove High School students are not ranked. Students receive letter grades (A, B, C, D, F) on their transcripts each semester. All Honors courses are weighted. The cumulative GPA is a weighted GPA. Over the last two years, 63% took at least one honors class in 11th or 12th grade, 41% took at least three and 15% took five or more.
